

Outer Space

OSIRIS-REx Asteroid Sample Return Mission Overview (Official NASA Briefing)

You may recall the presentation Steve Penniman gave us last February. Steve worked on this project with Andrew Duerner, son of our club member, Fred Duerner. This project launched in 2016.

On September 24, the OSIRIS-REx spacecraft will approach Earth and release its sample return capsule into the atmosphere on a path to land at the Department of Defense's Utah Test

and Training Range. The event makes it the first U.S. asteroid sample return. The touchdown will mark the end of a seven year journey to explore asteroid Bennu, collect a sample from its surface, and deliver it to Earth for study. Scientists around the world will study the sample over the coming decades to learn about how our planet and solar system formed, as well as the origin of organics that may have led to life on Earth.

MODEL A MECHANICAL

Would your Model A car pass a Test Drive?

From Model A Basics (modelabasics.com)















- Start the Model A it should start easily
- Move the spark advance lever all the way up and all the way down, you should notice a difference in the sound of the engine
- Close the GAV and the engine should want to starve for gas
- Check to see if the generator is charging
- Check all lights
- Check to make sure the horn works
- · Check operation of windshield wiper
- Check gas gauge to make sure it works
- The clutch should have about 1 inch of play before engaging
- The clutch should not chatter when engaged
- Before moving any distance, check to make sure you have brakes
- Bring the vehicle up to speed and check your stopping distance. It should stop smoothly and in a straight line
- The steering should not have more than 2 inch play
- The Model A should steer easily and not shimmy
- The vehicle should run smooth/strong and relatively quiet
- · Whine the engine out between shifts and listen for excessive gear noise
- The transmission should never pop out of gear. Test: going uphill, downhill and over a bump
- When traveling over a bump the A should not pull, jump or shimmy
- Take it up a long hill to see if it boils over.
- A stock/restored Model A will easily do 55 mph and ride very close to a normal car.
- After test ride and being parked, there should not be more than a quarter coin sized puddle under the flywheel housing.

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

LURE OF THE MODEL A

From poor man's horseless carriage to classic compact, aficianados of the Model A Ford grope for words to describe their own particular interest and hobby in one special breed of car.

The fascination, and to some, the preoccupation, with the Model A Ford has accelerated with the years rather than diminished. Typical of Americans, once an interest, soon a club. Two organizations, the Model A Ford Club of America, and the Model A Restorers Club have chapters all over the country.

MOST were infants

Rather than a limited membership and interest on the part of those who drove the original A's, most members were mere infants, if that, when the car was in its heyday. Family groups play a large part in organization activities with tours and gymkhanas as highlights of the year.

"Fierce but friendly partisanship to new ideas and products to develop our hobby" summed up William Berger as one of the special qualities of club activities. Berger and his wife Bernice started the restorers group in Marin, Calif., when he taught school there.

Now living at 6254 Momouth Ave., Goleta, they

are active in the local organization headed by Al Leenders of El Encanto Heights. Fiercely proud of their roadster, they have spent long and industrious hours not only in rebuilding, but perusing catalogs and carrying on voluminous correspondence with other owners and suppliers to find original parts. Once tracked down, an original part fast becomes a gem. They even remove the ashtrays at night.

"Some people play golf, some fish. We rebuild cars."

EVERYONE'S project

Dr. Ralph Nair of the University of California, Goleta campus and his son Ralph Jr. have developed a fatherson project into a consuming interest for the entire family. They now own four cars in various stages of

rehabilitation. Ralph Jr. proudly drives his so-called utility car, a jazzy 1930 cabriolet, with 67,435 original miles racked up, to Santa Barbara High School where he is a student.

Completely restored from the chassis to the quail radiator cap, all work including the body was done by the Nairs except the upholstery, chrome - plating and re-boring the engine block.

JUNK yard friends

In the process, the two men have not only become hopelessly addicted to the clasic car cult, but have made fast friends of numerous junk yard dealers and collectors all over southern California and elsewhere.

Sources of supply on this particular car reads like a road map. The license plate brackets came from Tennessee. The rumble seat cushlon from Milwaukee. One wheel from Oklahoma. Not to mention all the Sears-Roebuck finds.

SIMPLE beauty

Compared to present day automotive engineering, the almost insultingly simple lay-out of the Model A is guaranteed to put a gleam in the eye and an itch in the palm of the modern car tinkerer. If it needs a tuneup, you can almost crawl right under the hood. And without an oscilloscope, stethescope or Geiger counter, too. Lovely pre-space age tools like a screwdriver, lug wrench and pliers are all that are needed to ac: complish most needs.
