



MODJESKA HOUSE TOUR REPORT

On October 14th, Diamond Tread made the 28-mile trek from Cypress to Silverado to tour the historic Modjeska house. It was a gorgeous drive, with three of our Model As participating. Barry and Louise Beckley brought their 1928 Roadster, Chuck Mayhew drove his late 1931 Pickup, and Norman Saw joined Larry and Bonnie in the Ryan's 1929 Murray Sedan. Our tour arrived during the annular solar eclipse, and before meeting our docent we had a chance to view the eclipse through special solar glasses.

This historic home was constructed in the late 1870s and is well-preserved. Helena Modjeska was a Polish actress who broke social boundaries as a woman in the theater. She specialized in Shakespearean and other tragic roles. She broke the rules, and has been recognized as one of the greatest actresses.

In closing I wish that more of our membership community could have made this tour because it just doesn't get any better than this. The drive was great and the docent was the best: he gave us permission to have our cars on the estate for photos. We will have more tours like this, and I hope that more will start coming out for these nice drives.





At our October 3rd general membership meeting, Diamond Tread members learned about the early history of electric vehicles in the United States from Chris Risdon. This monthly series will continue in November:






