



Confemporary Car Advice





DESPITE the great advance made in scientific testing apparatus it ought to be encouraging to the car owner to know that there still are a number of parts which can best be checked over through actual operation of the car. When he takes a run around the block to feel the car's "pulse" he still is strictly up-to-date.

Spark plugs, for instance, cannot be accurately tested for their various functions on a device in the workshop. Such a device will, of course, show if a plug is dead or if the points are too far apart or too close together, but that is about all. In the engine the plugs do not behave as they do on the stand. A perfectly good set of plugs properly spaced, will cause a high compression engine to backfire on a hill if they happen to have cores that are a little too long. Being too near the piston tops the points get overheated and pre-ignite the gas.

To know just how a set of plugs will behave under any given condition it is necessary to put the engine to the actual road test. Sometimes the explosive impact is such as to show up a defect in a plug that might not be detected in a stationary test. The points may change their setting because of this impact.


