

I would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!





Prosperity Soup A Traditional New Year's Day Supper Serves twelve generously. 1/4 cup of each of the following:

Black eyed peas Bu Pinto beans Pearl barley Small beans Lentils

Butter beans or large lima beans Navy beans Split green peas ns Red beans

Great Northern beans

juice of 1 lemon salt and pepper to taste







Tiny Tips

Tiny Snell wrote for the Restorer in the 50s and 60s. Members would send in their tips for his column then perhaps win a new firewall patent data plate. Here are a few tips on repairing or restoring your Model A that might be worth revisiting.

- The Restorer often runs into a major problem when approaching the installation of the rear spring. This can be accomplished with little effort by inserting the spring into the rear frame member and installing one shackle complete. Place a 2"x4" block under both ends of the spring. Roll hydraulic floor jack under center section of the rear frame member and under the jack. Then bolt ends of chain together. As you jack the rear end up the chain prohibits the frame rom rising. The spring will spread to a place where the other shackle can be inserted and hooked up. Remove the top of the spring. The center bolt heqd will drop into place in the rear member. Attach the "U" bolts and tighten securely. Before removing the instrument panel or doing any work at the ammeter or ignition switch the battery should be disconnected.
- To prevent the drain hole in the flywheel housing from becoming plugged up be sure to insert a cotter pin from inside and bend open. This cotter key will help keep the hole open.
- When filling the pan for the first time in a rebuilt engine put the oil in through the distributor shaft to be sure main bearings receive oil at once.
- In cold weather the generator voltage is considerable higher than normal. This is sometimes noticeable by the blueish white color of the light from the bulbs. The increased voltage is caused by low temperature of the electrolyte, which increases the internal resistance in the battery, and in order to maintain a constant charging rate, the generator voltage correspondingly increases. The voltage increase often exceeds normal operating limits due to charging rate set too high or due to loose connection in the battery gen circuit. This can result in prematurely burned out light bulbs. To correct this situation



first clean and tighten all connections starting at the battery terminals. Don't forget the ground connection. If bulbs continue to burn out, generator output should be reduced 2 to 4 amps. The battery can be used as a guide in determining the correct charging rate by making successive hydrometer readings and recording them. Gen charging rate should be adjusted until the battery registers no consistent loss of gravity or does not use an excessive amount of water.

Model A Era Fashion Corner Antique Clothing Collectors Criteria by Nancy Willet

Collecting antique clothing can be lots of fun and rewarding. To avoid costly mistakes here are some guides to use.

•Condition: Inspect the fabric carefully, a small tear could mean something larger later. Look for repairs, as sometimes these are not done in the best interest of the fabric. A garment in mint condition could fetch a higher price, but might be a better investment in the long run.

•Style: Does the garment have beautiful lines and is it well made?

•Design: Vintage clothing should have clear lines, quality of structure, color and texture.

•Structure: How a garment, or fabric is made is crucial to determining the age and price.

• Material: What is it made of, or from? Is there more than one type of workmanship involved, and is the material and workmanship still used today?

•Quality: Thought in designing or the care given in workmanship can never be underestimated.

When shopping for vintage clothing have a tape measure handy to measure clothing size and fabric length. Standardized sizing started in the forties as a result of fabric rationing during the war. Taking measurements is the best way to size a garment. Look carefully for rust stains on whites and perspiration stains on all clothing before you purchase, because they are not easy to remove.

But, most of all have fun looking for that great vintage outfit!
