

${\mathbb F}$ ashion and facts from the model a ford era

This article is a continuation of last month's focus on what proud owners of the new Ford Model A were watching in their neighborhood theaters. In 1929 (the second full year of production of the Model A), the number one movie that year was "Broadway Melody." It was the top grossing picture of 1929. It won the Academy Award for Best Picture and received nominations for best director and best actress. The plot involves a small-time vaudeville act, the Mahoney Sisters, Queenie and Hank, who come to New York to break into Broadway. They meet men they hope will promote their career and end up involved in complex love triangles.





The story also includes the soon-to-become cliché plot device of a lead singer having an accident at rehearsal, giving one of the sisters her big break. Although the plot is somewhat dated by today's standards, it is considered the first complete example of the Hollywood musical and helped to establish the concept and structure of the Hollywood musicals to follow including its own later additions: Broadway Melody of 1936, Broadway Melody of 1939, and Broadway Melody of 1940. A full 4K restoration was just released this year on Blu-ray.

Here is a clip from the movie featuring the title song sung by a male vocalist accompanied by a chorus line of dancers and a solo dancer who performs an amazing tap dance on her toes!

MGM released a second musical that year entitled "The Hollywood Revue"-a two-hour extravaganza of variety acts that included some segments in technicolor. The impressive cast list included Jack Benny, Marion Davies, John Gilbert, Norma Shearer, Lionel Barrymore, Buster Keaton and Laurel and Hardy, to name just a few. A major hit song introduced in the movie was "Singing in the Rain" which would later be reprised in the memorable 1952 movie of the same name. My favorite segment in "The Hollywood Review" introduced a very young Joan Crawford, singing and dancing, accompanied by a male quartet. Back in the 1980's, I personally got to know two of the members of that quartet: Paul Gibbons (left of Joan seated on the piano) and Bill Seckler (on the right). We remained close friends throughout the rest of their lives. I spoke at Bill's funeral. I never get tired of watching this clip of that segment and hope you will enjoy it too.




