Safety Clinic a success!



We are putting together a fun tour for Saturday March 24. With tour season now in full swing, I am reprinting a reminder from Phil Francis, President of Model A Restorer's Club of Arizona: "It is not time to relax on maintenance for your Model A. You don't need a shop full of fancy tools to keep your car on the road. The most elementary services will keep your car running.

Moving parts require lubrication. There are about 29 grease fittings on the average Model A. Neglect these at your own peril. Don't forget to oil the generator if you have one, the distributor, and the throttle cross over shaft on the fire wall. And check the air pressure in all the tires including the spare."

Doesn't every car have a generator? I'll ask about that on Saturday. See you soon!

Email Interview With Our Newest Member



When Chris Christensen bought his 1931 Town Sedan

Many of our members may have met Chris. He will be returning to participate in our activities in March and will be helping our Annie Villarreal recover from her knee replacement surgery. In the meantime, I sent him a list of question. Below are his replies with only the slightest of edits.

Q. Chris, where you born, what is your work background and how did you become interested in Model A Ford's?

A.My whole name is Jan Sverre Christensen, but I'm called Chris. I am 79 years old, born and living in Oslo the capital of Norway in

Europe. I am a mechanical engineer and an Industrial designer. My first Model A was bought in 1962, a 1931 Tudor. I sold it the year after to buy the 1931 Town Sedan, I have had this one all the years to now. I love the model A's fantastic technology.

Q. Can you tell us about your English Model A and when you first bought it?

A. My model A is collected in England from parts coming from USA. It is a little different with right hand wheel and the throttle pedal in between the clutch and brake pedal. Inside, artificial leather in dark blue, and it has small fender lights. The small English engine was changed to a normal type when it was imported to Norway in 1932. It is all original including the interior. I have a 1931 pick-up project that I have had for many years, and never get ready?

Q. How did you meet Annie?

A. Annie was coming from vacation in Germany last summer to give a speech in our Norsk Modell A Ford club in Oslo. She lived here for one week and we got to know each other.




Q. I understand you can help when we have garage days with our cars. Can you tell us more about that? A. With so many years of Ford A repairing and restoring I have learning something. In addition being an engineer I can combine theory and practice. Since 1969 and up till today, I have made technical articles and drawings in our magazine "A"visen (means: The paper in Norwegian) under the name "Fordeler" that means advantages in Norwegian. Last magazine had number 201. Perhaps there will be a book made from it?

Q. Can you tell us about your Club? What is it's name and when did it start? How long have you been a member? I understand you have been president of your club and that you are newsletter editor of your club now. Can you tell us more about that?

A. The Norsk "A" Model Klubb was established in 1967 and I have been a member since the start, I have been editor, president and editor many years. We have approximately 400 members and for many years we are a family club.

Q. What is it like driving a Model A in Norway? Do you have special precautions you need to take with the


cold and snow? What kind of outings do you go on in the summer?

Even though Buster is nearly 20 years older than me, He still calls me "Daddy" cause I'm the one that keeps him Happy!


There is something about old cars that you don't get with the new, Each one is different—They're as individual as you!



Our recent Guest Speaker and Restorer Magazine Fashion Editor, Sherry Winkinhofer, just posted on the Model A Era Fashions Group on Facebook about a recent jackpot she got at a local auction: A Rock Crystal necklace, strung on a chain for \$6! She says she knew the minute she picked it up it was rock crystal, even before seeing the chain. It was much colder than the other glass beads it was next to! The chain, instead of cording was a strong indicator and if it is noticeably colder than other jewelry, it's Model A Era.! It was enough evidence for her to buy it and check for other clues later.

How can you tell if jewelry is rock crystal? When holding crystal up to a light source, you can see a refraction of light—

i.e., a small rainbow. Rock crystal has this same refraction capability and is harder and more durable than man-made crystal. Because genuine rock crystal is a mineral, its identity can be confirmed with a gem tester that indicates hardness. Rock crystal jewelry expressed the Art Deco aesthetic that began in the 1910's and reached it's peak in the 1920's and 1930's. Congrats on your great find, Sherry! Beautiful!



MODEL A MECHANICAL

"The Horn Goes Off When I Turn Right when the Headlights are On"

On the MAFCA Facebook Page, Kenny Mcatee asked a question about his 1931 Model A Truck. He said, "I've been working on it's 2-tooth steering (box) since I bought it. I had 12 inches of slop when I started. When I got the slop out, steering was so tight I could hardly turn it. So yesterday I get it kinda where I want it. Now when I turn right with the headlights on the horn goes off!. Is the steering wheel bent or what? I just want to hear from someone else before I tear into it."

Later: "Also a lot of popping going on while steering was tight. Can you break the steering wheel?"

Below are some of the answers he got besides "Don't turn right when the headlights are on." (John G.): Eddie Olson (Top Contributor): I'm not any kind of expert, but can speak from experience on this. If that light switch on the bottom of the column is not together and attached exactly right, all kinds of things will happen when you turn the wheel.

<u>Jordan Moreau:</u> When I had this happen, the U-shaped clip that retains the "spider" had fallen out. The aftermarket ones are a little oversized and don't nest nicely in the spider. A little filing allows it to nest correctly and I haven't had the issue since.

<u>Ken Coleman (Top Contributor)</u> The adjustments to the 2-tooth are certain and precise. Sounds like you need an instruction manual. Les Andrews Red Book covers this thoroughly such as binding and all indications of the problem. Horn troubles too.

There were other great answers. What would you recommend?




