Another point is that the degree of saturation of the wick is increased when the engine is stopped. A heavier charge of oil goes into the cylinders during the very first suction strokes of the pistons when starting.

Opening the door of the car the keeper of the Show Case leaned over to a point just below the instrument panel, turned a dial and brought in a station that was playing, "I love love." Love certainly was beginning to make everything spin round.

"What kind of car radio is that?" the curious visitor asked. "It seems to attach to the dash without cutting any holes through the panel. What's this, anyway —a special outfit for quick installation? I'd like to ..."

But the salesman was introducing another musical note, this time from a double-toned horn. The note was attention compelling, yet pleasing to the ear. In appearance it was quite unusual by reason of the fact that it was made up of a master and a junior horn, each chromium plated. "We'll have to go back to the old violin makers with their skill in ingeniously harmonizing and blending vibrations in order to understand why these vibro-balanced horns are smarter and better. Take your usual horn, chart the oscillations and you will find that the curve is jagged and irregular. A clear, harmonious tone, however, gives perfect uniformity of the oscillations. But this is not the only advantage. This double horn gives you full strength vibrations — and thus warning safety — within one or two hundredths of a second after electrical contact is made. Furthermore, this is accomplished even when battery strength is low. And, the tone lasts!"

A feature that served to bring the shopper to his feet was the additional device which enables the driver to obtain a continuous "high-low" signal. This is a rotary switch, which, incidentally, can be used where any two horns are employed. A tone reducer switch is another horn accessory which enables the driver to get two tones with one horn. There was no music in the next offering over the Show Case but it said a lot. In appearance it looked like any one of several conventional oil filters but the truth is it's an improved type intended for replacing the usual kind.

"Here's a filter that lives up to its name," the specialty specialist was saying. "Oil enters the top direct from the oil pump, passes through oil inlet holes and must go through two filtering cups and two special fine mesh screens before it is free to go its way through the oil line. Even this cleaned oil is caught in baffle plates at the bottom of the tank so that if there still is any sediment this cannot swirl and get back into the oil stream. Any water in the oil passes through along with excess sediment into a lower chamber which can be drained off from time to time. Thus there is no need to replace entire cartridges since only small refills are necessary.

The outstanding feature of the filter is that it permits full flow of the oil yet filters it four times each trip through the device.

"You will now hear from your station announcer," broke in the radio.

"Now what is this car radio, anyway?" demanded the shopper. "I've been thinking of trying one on my car but there seems to be too much fuss about it. I don't like the idea of carving up the dash and ripping up the upholstery. If this is something easy to install, bring it out."

"The interesting part of it is they use A.C. tubes in that set instead of the D.C. variety, even though it operates on the direct current of your storage battery," the other explained. "That may seem like a contradiction but the point is the A.C. screen-grid tubes compensate for the fluctuations of demand on the car's current. They stop that pulsating which you may have noticed sometimes in other automobile radio sets. And a feature that ought to interest you is the fact that the loudspeaker can be removed from the car to entertain a crowd at an outdoor gathering or if you want to have it in your tent on the camping trip."

The keeper of the Show Case turned another trick, however, by lifting the hood and pointing out something else new in the way of top cylinder oilers when the shopper thought he was going to be initiated into the mysteries of this new radio receiver. Ordinarily the device is enclosed in a guard but this had been removed to show the reason why the oiler supplies an extra shot of oil the instant the motor starts.

"You'll note that the outlet tube has a U-turn with a slight feed cup in it," came the explanation. "The minute the engine stops there is a storage of extra oil in this turn all ready for injection into the engine when you are prepared to start. That's one feature.

"Another is the method of oil pick-up which is very much like the jet of a carburetor except that the air passes through the jet with the fluid drawn in from outside. This oiler also has an air filter and screens to keep any foreign matter from entering the oil vapor stream. It even carries vibrator pins to keep the passages clean.


"Here is an oiler that does not feed by bubbling air through the oil. In this one the oiling is not dependent upon suction, which as you know usually isn't sufficient when the throttle is opened wide and the engine needs oil most, but works on the principle of gravity feed. The variations in suction do not affect it and there is no difference in efficiency because of the variation in the quantity of the lubricant. As long as there is any oil in the container it will feed to the engine."

"That sounds like music to me," admitted the shopper. "And now, just so I can mix a little entertainment with all this practical business, let me in on the secret of this new radio."

Opening the door, the salesman pointed to an affair about the size of a man's hand which clamped to the right side of the instrument board. It carried an illuminated station selector, two controls and a key to lock it. The shielded set and speaker were attached to the dash out of sight, the selector and volume controls being of the remote type with all mechanism and wiring in a single cable.

"There's the first receiver adaptable to all cars without alterations in the car itself," he enthused. "Tune in!"

And while the shopper listened the guardian of the amazing Show Case lost no time tuning in on the well exercised cash register.

For several years now, I have felt the need to get the Southern California Regional Group (SCRG) to a position where it could play a more vital role in supporting the Chapters and the Model A hobby in Southern California. Following Covid, which put a damper on the annual SCRG meetings, and at the request of Marline and Elaine Perry, who wished to retire from their leadership roles, I and some others organized a Chapter Representatives meeting at the Orange County Pancake Breakfast in 2023, 14 of the 24 Chapters in the Southern California Region were present.

I have attended many Central California Regional Group weekends, which were always wonderful and well

attended. The knowledge that if we could hold one in our own backyard, the Southern California Chapters and the hobby would benefit was my motivation to get involved.

3. To support the MAFCA parent organization by assisting and coordinating MAFCA special meetings and gatherings.

4. To encourage Chapters to hold a Regional Event over a number of days with a variety of activities, including an annual meeting of the SCRG. These Regional Meets should be open to anyone with an interest in Model A Fords. The SCRG would provide financial assistance in the form of gifts and loans as approved by a majority vote of the Chapter Representatives for those meets.

5. To provide advice to individual Chapters, promote and enhance the growth and development of the hobby of Model A Ford preservation, and invite hobbyists to join and participate at the chapter level.

At the initial meeting in 2023, it was obvious that not one of the Chapters were interested in sponsoring a Regional Group activity. However, the most significant expression of lack of interest in the SCRG was the response to our initial interactive membership meeting on ZOOM, which focused on building club membership. Only one person of the nineteen who were invited joined the meeting. Doug Diller was that person and he assumed the position of Vice President.

The present: The bottom line is that the SCRG needs additional volunteers to join us as "officers at large." The current officers have agreed to stay on. Still, we need to expand the officer group to include members who believe that the SCRG can be beneficial to all the Chapters in Southern California. For the SCRG to continue as a viable organization, we need additional people to bring us their enthusiasm, contacts, ideas and love of this wonderful hobby.

What does "officer at large" entail? It entails meeting on ZOOM every 4-6 weeks with the other officers to decide on what we can do to provide something meaningful to the Southern California Chapters. We are not scheming to have our new helpers organize a multi-day event: Far from that! The next meeting of the SCRG Chapter Representatives, who are the Board Members of SCRG, will be held at the Orange County Pancake Breakfast, where I will ask for people to join me.
