Ford's Feathered Friends and Conservation Legacy

Henry Ford, known for revolutionizing the automobile industry, had another lesser-known passion: birds. This deep love for avian life started early in his life. He often reminisced about his first memory, which involved a bird's nest, and he even marked his first car drive by the arrival of bobolinks, migratory birds.



Ford once imported various bird species, like yellow-hammers and chaffinches, to America. However, he later realized that birds should live freely in their natural habitats. His passion for birds also led him to become a fan of John Burroughs, an American ornithologist and naturalist. Despite Burroughs' criticism of cars, Ford admired his work and gifted him a car. Initially hesitant, Burroughs eventually used the car to explore bird habitats more efficiently, leading to a lasting friendship between the two.

Burroughs informed Ford about the struggling Weekes-McLean Bird Bill, aimed at protecting migratory birds. Ford sprang into action, mobilizing his vast dealer network to lobby Congress. This marked Ford's first political activism, resulting in the successful passage of the bill in 1913.

Henry Ford's legacy is not only defined by his industrial achievements but also by his significant contributions to bird conservation. His dedication to creating bird sanctuaries and preserving natural habitats highlighted his belief that "birds are the best companions." Ford's activism for birds remains an inspiring part of his multifaceted life.

Want to make an evening of it? Arrive early and join fellow club members for dinner at the Horseless Carriage restaurant. Great food and even better company!




