**Tour report for November** – Forest Lawn Glendale – What a perfect day for us to tour on over to view the painting of the Crucifixion along with the one of Christ's resurrection. These paintings were originally painted in 1894 by Jan Styka who traveled to Jerusalem to sketch the landscape and architecture in the hope of creating the most accurate representation. Of which he most certainly did! We were met at the Forest Lawn MUSEUM by our docent Sophia.

In 1896 the painting was unveiled in Warsaw and it claimed fame as it traveled around Europe. When ready to be sent to the USA, it was wrapped on a telephone pole and shipped. When it arrived here, there was no place large enough to display it so it was put into storage.

The painting came to Forest Lawn visionary Dr. Hubert Eaton's attention in 1944. He bought it and erected a special building to house it, which is known today as "The Hall of Crucifixion".

As part of the museum, there is an extraordinary art collection where artists can study and sketch, teachers can bring children where they can see things they read about in books. The museum displays a permanent collection as well as world-class rotating exhibits where there is always something new to experience. Leaving the museum it was over to the Mausoleum to view the statues there plus a brilliant stained glass recreation of Leonardo da Vinci's famous painting, the Last Supper,
