REPLACING MITCHELL OVERDRIVE TORQUE TUBES

On a recent excursion with the San Fernando Valley Model A's, my Mitchell overdrive failed. I started feeling resistance while shifting, and just as I was about to get on the freeway, I heard a clunk—it felt really bad. I quickly turned around and coasted to a parking lot, where I stopped to inspect the issue. I discovered the overdrive had rotated about 45 degrees. Both torque tubes were sheared at the flanges that connected to the overdrive.



While waiting for a tow, I left a message for Steve Mitchell, who called me back withing 5 minutes. He said this is the first time he had this happen in 35 years and was very surprised and apologetic. He promised to send replacements the following week, as soon as possible, which he did. During the week, I coordinated a work party that Larry Singler generously offered to host, so we could use his lift.

On the following Saturday, about a dozen generous Model A'ers met at Larry's and attacked the rear end of my Tudor. In the process, we realized that one of the leaves of my rear spring was broken, so we had to figure out a plan to replace that. So, this wasn't going to get finished in a day. I also had been planning to soon replace my rear brake drums, as they were still the steel type. So, we added that to the workplan as well. When we concluded for the day, the rear end was assembled with the new torque tubes, minus the leaf spring.

The following Monday, Larry disassembled the rest of the leaf spring, took it to a sand blaster and had them all cleaned up, then got them all painted for reassembly. He had a replacement leaf for the one that was broken from my spring set, so we reassembled the spring that day and installed it in the rear end.

The next day Larry, Russ Evans and I attacked what should have been the fairly simple task of setting the rear end back in and bolting the spring back on. However, fate had a different plan for us. When we got the spring set up into the frame, we discovered the U bolt was stripped. We cannibalized Larry's project car for a replacement, but had to cut a hole in the bottom of the body to replace it. Then, we decided to check if the U spring bolt was lined up properly, which it wasn't, so we fought that for a while before we got everything back together. After four hours, we called it a day.

The following Saturday, Larry and I visited Randy Gross to get parts to replace the rear brakes. We got almost everything put back together when we got back, then finished the next day, adjusted the brakes and I was back on the road.

I appreciate everyone that came to help. It was also great to get greasy again with my long time friend and second dad, John Addington who taught me auto mechanics when I was a teenager and got me into this crazy hobby in the last few years. 
Model A Youth Restoration Awards
