LOSING A GREAT FRIEND, PAST PRESIDENT AND MR. MODEL A

What can I say about my friend, Bob Travis. I first met Bob and Joyce when we attended the Santa Anita A's Installation for the 1997 Board and Officers. It was held at Coco's banquet room in Pasadena, corner of Colorado and Michillinda. Both of us couples were very new to the club, having joined in 1996, and while the installation itself was going on, we sat in the rear on some stairs getting to know each other.

At that point in our Model A ownership, Bob had a Deluxe Phaeton, and I had a 1928 roadster pickup that I purchased from former SAA member Andrew Morrison. Both Bob and I had Model A's as our first car in high school, and both grew up in New York.

When Bob and Joyce joined the club, Bob had recently purchased a 1930 Deluxe Phaeton with a goal of turning it into a points car. Later he would win a MARC Award of Excellence.

Bob and Joyce had moved to Arcadia following his 30 years in the Army. He had taken a job in Pasadena with Loral, a defense contractor, allowing him to use his knowledge and skills in civilian life. He lived on Woodacre St. in Arcadia which was about 1 mile from the office. Even then he knew he needed a larger garage.

Bob had lived in the Albuquerque area while in the Army and happened to have a relative nearby. Bob got the itch for another Model, and in 1962, he purchased his 1930 sedan. In 1964, he was one of the founders of the Poco Quatros Model A Club. When the Army moved him on, he stored the car in his relative's barn where it sat until I went with him to retrieve it.

Bob became president of the Santa Anita A's for 1999 and again 2000. He repeated the presidency for 2013, 2014, 2015, and again in 2018. It was a busy club over those years and that's the way Bob liked it. He was a great fan of touring and the club often had tours, many that Bob organized and were overnight for 5 or 6 days.

One of mine and Bob's early involvement with a MAFCA National Convention was in 1998 in Reno, Nevada. Bob, with my occasional help, had replaced parts and pieces to bring the Deluxe Phaeton to what he hoped would be a high points car in judging. The trip to Reno was a club event with Bob towing the Phaeton. I remember that on the night before the judging, Bob discovered that he was missing the correct cotter pin on the front end. While walking around the convention, he came across Les Andrews' perfectly restored front end that was on display. And there was the cotter pin. Bob returned to his car to get a tool to extract the pin, and then, later at night while I kept my eye out for others, he removed the pin from the display. Bob received a good points score but not enough to get the trophy he wanted.

For the next two years, Bob worked to increase the point count. He solicited the help from a MAFCA qualified judge, Ron Mosher. Bob was also a qualified judge on interiors. Then it was off to the 2000 National Convention in Kansas City, Kansas. What a trip. It was a good Convention. However, the car did not score the points that Bob was looking for. It actually scored lower than in Reno. He was not a happy camper. Can you imagine driving 1500 miles back with Bob to Arcadia after that? The most exciting part of the trip home was when the siding on the borrowed enclosed car trailer began to strip off while on a fast toll road, and I was driving. It is a long story of how we made a U-Turn to get back to a hardware store. The repair involved many metal screws and rolls of duct tape. Bob eventually won the Award of Excellence he had been seeking.

Bob loved driving and long-distance driving was no problem and he always owned large vehicles with great towing capacity. I went with him to retrieve his Model A in Albuquerque. It is 773 miles. Bob purchased a new enclosed trailer at the factory in Arizona on the way to New Mexico. After loading up the car at his relative's barn, we headed home. It took two days to get home, with a brief stop in Palmdale for it must have been "Meet your local Highway Patrol Officer Day".

MR. MODEL A CONTINUED

Bob loved touring as did I. We, and many Santa Anita A's members, were excited when we first learned about the formation of the Model A Touring Club and the trip to Europe in September 2001. On this trip were 50 Model As from around the county, which were split into two groups. All of the Santa Anita A's members were together. Our Santa Anita group, plus one other from Massachusetts, traveled together and did our own thing each day as we moved to the next hotel.

Once we got rolling, almost every day, Bob was the leader, and Joyce was the navigator. We all had walkie-talkies so we could keep together. There was only one day in Germany when Bob forgot the meaning of a German road sign and turned onto a one-way street going the opposite direction. (Bob had lived in Germany while in the Army. He also married Joyce while there) The rest of the group didn't follow. We had an interesting stop at a Ford dealership while waiting for Bob and Joyce to join us.

Bob and I grew together as we learned and got more into the hobby. Bob was my best friend, and he was a friend to all the members of the club. I believe I spent 3 days a week at Bob's garage working on mine, his, and other club member's cars. Bob was always willing to help others and was a great font of knowledge on the working of the Model A. Eventually, Bob had to build a storage shed behind his garage to keep spare parts available.

Bob restored two of his cars and had a weekly commitment for two years helping another with the restoration of his Model A.

Most all of the club members during Bob's really active years can attest to the help and knowledge that he provided. The club today is stronger because of Bob's influence on the club and the support he gave to members. Bob truly earned the title of "Mr. Model A".



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
