Highlights of the May Tech Seminar

Technical Update: Patience and Flexibility, Put Those In Your Toolkit

On July 11 members gathered at **Bonnie Nardulli's** house for several technical topics centered on her Model A. The main topic was to install a new float on the fuel gauge. Fortunately, **Bonnie** had a very nice brass float and the right parts to install it. We reviewed several special gas gauge tool options, several styles of floats as well as the options for gasket kits. The float installation and gauge rebuild was pretty straightforward and almost went without any hiccups. Almost... A major challenge arose when it was time to reinstall the dash panel with a new aftermarket temperature gauge bracket. The bottom dash screws just would not line up. **Jennifer Ferrario** entertained all of us as she dove in head first (literally) to try and fit the offending screws in the dash. My back and neck hurt for three days by just watching her efforts.

Our second project was to figure out why it was running poorly. Recently, another member had temporarily changed the spark plugs to a known good set and said that the car ran well but overheated quickly. Based on that report, we installed new plugs but did not get the same results. After some head scratching, several components were tested, a few swapped out, and ultimately the timing was re-set. Changing the timing generated the most improvement, but it still does not seem to be running properly. We know the points are bad and need changing but did not have the appropriate parts to do that—set for a future visit. The good news is that the timing adjustment seems to have abated the overheating problem.

While we did not achieve all of our goals, some improvements were noted and plans were set for addressing the other known issues. This car certainly is making us think and is testing our problem solving abilities!

Next month, Matt Pavich will demonstrate shock absorber rebuilding at Steve Pavich's Fountain Valley home. As usual, donuts/coffee at 8:30, seminar at 9:00. The Pavich's have plenty of chairs, so just show up to get shocked!

Originally started in 1977 by Steve's father, Glen Mitchell, they manufacture every aspect of the parts necessary for the overdrives, and all of the internals for the transmissions, at their facilities. Thank you Steve and Cindy for showing us everything involved with producing your very fine overdrives and transmissions. It was a **REAL** pleasure meeting with the both of you....



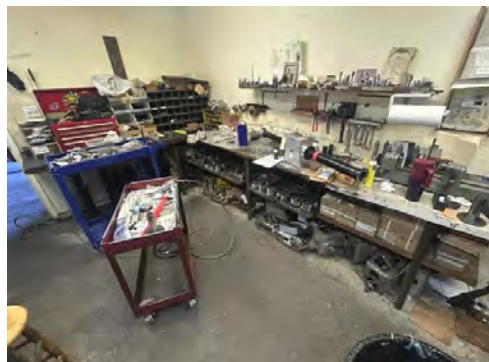

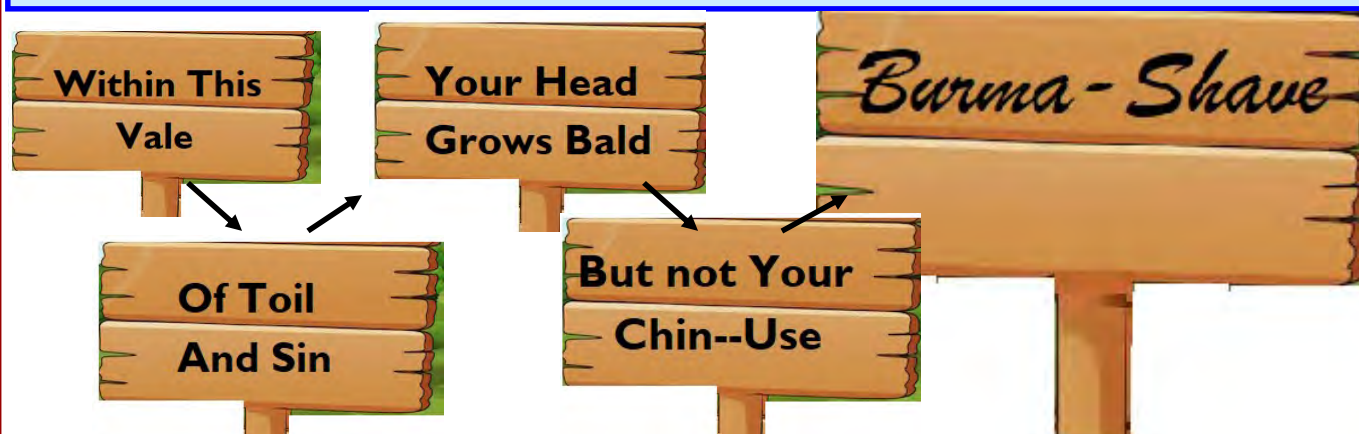


Bucks and Ballyhoo...by Diane Gaughen

Route 66 wasn't just a great way to get across the country, but it was a way to make money and be a part of adventures. June Morris was a kid who grew up watching Route 66 being constructed near her grandfather's farm in Miller, Missouri. She got to see matinee idol Douglas Fairbanks drive his sweetie, Mary Pickford on the highway. She also witnessed a giant flatbed truck carrying the huge mirror to the Mount Palomar Observatory in California. This was more fun than going to the movies!

One of the greatest events for sheer outrageousness was the time in 1928 when sports promoter C. C. Pyle staged a 3400-mile footrace (The Bunion Derby) from Los Angeles to Chicago following Route 66. It continued on from there all the way to New York City and ended 3 months later. The prize for the winner was \$25,000! Teletype and radio allowed people to follow the fates of the runners until they finally made it to their destination. It was great publicity for the not-yet-fully-paved road.

The winner was Andy Payne, a Cherokee Indian who had grown up on a farm in Oklahoma. He hoped the prize money would help his family who was struggling and pay for his wedding! Oklahoma welcomed the runners and Will Rogers even offered a prize to the first runner to reach his hometown of Claremore.
